Old Bellevue: Main Street – 100th Avenue to Bellevue Way *Traffic Study*

Main Street Study: Over the next several weeks, city traffic engineers will be collecting data and studying the Main Street corridor between 100th Avenue and Bellevue Way in an effort to improve traffic flow and safety. The focus of the study will be the intersections at 101st Avenue and 102nd Avenue.



A number of potential changes will be evaluated. Engineers will look at:

- Signal modifications,
- Turn restrictions,
- Adding stop signs at intersections.

Crosswalk Flag Pilot Project: In a separate effort, the city is undertaking a pilot program to provide high visibility flags for pedestrians at the two un-signalized crosswalks on Main Street in Old Bellevue. Engineers will be observing the crosswalks and evaluating the effectiveness of the flags over the next several months.
